PASTOR'S MESSAGE

February is the month of love, right?

So, I thought it would be appropriate to write about relationships and Jesus' call for us to love God and each other. But, then I thought about the fact that February is the month of the upcoming General Conference in St. Louis, Feb 23-26, when lay and clergy delegates of United Methodist conferences will be gathering from all around the world to discuss the future of our denomination in the wake of serious differences regarding the inclusion of the LGBTQ community. Questions of ordination and same-sex unions are at the heart of the conversation and proposals will be voted on by delegates to guide our future as a United Methodist family.

On the one hand, one could say that the topic of the General Conference is just about biblical interpretation and church polity and has little to do with love. But, the truth is, it has a lot to do with love and how we engage this conversation has everything to do with love. And we have biblical guidance for what we are dealing with. The apostle Paul wrote often to early Christian churches in conflict over various issues. When he wrote the church in Corinth he wrote to them about the importance of treating one another with honor and respect (I Corinthian 12) in the midst of their differences. And he not only wrote to them about loving one another, he spelled out what that meant. In the 13th chapter of his first letter to the Corinthians he tells them. Love is patient and kind, Love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It is not irritable or resentful. It does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes, all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. (I Cor 13:4-7)



That said. I do believe that it is God, who is Love (I John 4:8) who will guide us. And I hope you will join me in praying for our delegates as they gather this month. Pray that they will embody the Spirit of Love, that they will be guided by God's hand. And pray that we all will remember Paul's admonition to the people of Corinth.

But, let me say this. Whatever happens in St. Louis, we at St. Luke's United Methodist Church will continue to gather on the corner Youree Drive and Sand Beach Blvd. We will continue to worship and study and pray and serve and love.

Because Love never ends. (I Cor 13:15)
