So often we look at Lent as something we are supposed to give up briefly only to pick it back up again 40 days later. We pick something that easily fits into our lifestyle and doesn't challenge us. But what if we put down the hard stuff in our life and picked up or replaced it with something more meaningful, long lasting, and life changing?

During this season of Lent, I want to invite you into a "soul reset." A time of picking up and practicing spiritual disciplines that help you reconnect with our first love, God. You can do that through a 6-week Bible study led by Rev. Sandra Huber on Mondays at 10 am or 6 pm in the Genesis classroom. We will follow this same theme in a preaching series during the Lenten season as well.

Also, instead of giving up something during Lent, you can also give back. Our Mission Committee will be hosting a baby shower throughout Lent for much needed items for new moms such as diapers, wipes, pacifiers,

diaper rash cream and trial size lotion and shampoo. These items will be stored at the church and shared with all parents who have a need. You will find more information about this opportunity in your bulletin. It is St. Luke's way of "loving our littles at Lent."

There are many ways to change a life at Lent. One of them might be yours.

News from Pumpkin Patch Grower:

I can't express how badly I feel after the 2019 pumpkin season. We disappointed many of you, our partners. Many of your organizations have come to depend on the revenue produced by the patches. In recent years our partners collectively have realized over \$6,000,000 per year for your charitable causes. This year our partners were down to around \$4,000,000. Over 160 partners either received no pumpkins, only part of their regular shipments or damaged pumpkins loaded after the freeze.

In 2019, the freeze involved record lows. In the 28 years we've grown in New Mexico we have never experienced a complete destruction of the crop as early as October 10th. Over 300 acres were lost.

In order to prevent this from happening in future years, we have secured an additional growing location at a lower altitude. We will grow a portion of the crop at these spots. Since the best quality pumpkins are grown at higher altitudes, we will still grow the majority of our crop on the Navajo Farm.

Many of our partners have expressed concern regarding Pumpkin Patch's financial situation. We will plant our normal 1100 acres of pumpkins and ornamentals and will be able to fully supply all of our existing and new partners in 2020. We mechanized our harvest process in 2019 to increase our capacity to harvest miniatures, gourds and pie pumpkins.

Due to the losses of 2019, we have been forced to liquidate some assets and we have laid off ½ of our permanent employees. We hope to be able to rehire them as things improve. Please thank all of the volunteers at your church for all their work.
