**PASTOR'S MESSAGE** 



I borrow these words from Philippians 1:2-6 GRACE BE UNTO YOU, AND PEACE, FROM GOD OUR FATHER, AND FROM THE LORD JESUS CHRIST. I THANK MY GOD UPON EVERY REMEMBRANCE OF YOU. ALWAYS IN EVERY PRAYER OF MINE FOR YOU ALL, MAKING REQUEST WITH JOY. FOR YOUR FELLOWSHIP

IN THE GOSPEL FROM THE FIRST DAY UNTIL NOW; BEING CONFIDENT OF THIS VERY THING, THAT HE WHICH HATH BEGUN A GOOD WORK IN YOU WILL PERFORM IT UNTIL THE DAY OF JESUS CHRIST.

November is the season of thanksgiving. When the air is crisp and the sun is shining it can be easy to recognize that we have much for which to be thankful. I know also that November is the season for mid-term elections which can raise tremendous anxiety in our nation and that we are reeling from the violence and hatred of the last week of October. I am also deeply aware that the United Methodist

church is facing great divisions over theological and biblical interpretations that will impact our future together. How do we remain hopeful and grateful amid anxiety and uncertainty?

Scripture reminds us that we are to give thanks in every circumstance. Scripture reminds

us that God has begun a good work in us. And I believe that an attitude of gratitude, trusting in God's work among us, helps us to remain aligned with God's intention for us. Gratitude helps us to see where God is present, even in confusing and uncertain times. Gratitude focuses our attention.

Let me tell you what I mean. In these times of hatred and division, rejection of people who are different from us, there are also people and places where love and kindness and compassion carry the day. Our congregation has long been relatively homogeneous with many of us looking alike and coming from similar backgrounds. I looked across our congregation this past weekend and caught a glimpse of the kingdom of God. Many ages and ethnicities, families of all sorts – single parents with children, grandparents with grandchildren, families formed from biology and adoption single folks, married folks, gay, straight – people with


different theological and sociological leanings all gathered in the house of the Lord for worship. Handshakes and hugs

shared with people who will vote differently this month. A welcoming smile offered to friends who have been at St. Luke's for a lifetime and to those who only just came through the doors this week. As I thought about the stories of the people gathered, I gave thanks for the many ways people come. You have come because you were brought by your family. You have come because someone offered you a hand during a troubled time. You have come because someone in the community told you that you would find a place here. You have come because the warmth you felt when you attended Low Key or an AA meeting or a youth paintball outing or Breakfast with Santa or Upper Third made you decide to drop in on a Sunday morning.

IN THESE TIMES OF HATRED AND DIVISION, REJECTION OF PEOPLE WHO ARE DIFFERENT FROM US, THERE ARE ALSO PEOPLE AND PLACES WHERE LOVE AND KINDNESS AND COMPASSION CARRY THE DAY.

God is doing a good work among us. I know we live in troubled times. But, I look across our congregation and see the body of Christ in all our difference and diversity, loving and celebrating and supporting one another, making a place for all of God's children and I thank

God upon every remembrance of you. It is a season of thanksgiving and I believe that God will guide God's people. I see it. Don't you?

# DONNIE BROOK COMMISSIONED AS LAY SERVANT!


On Sunday, October 21<sup>st</sup>, Donnie Brook was commissioned to continue in her role as Lay Servant at St. Luke's United Methodist.

# INVITATION TO THE SHREVEPORT DISTRICT LISTENING SESSION (NOVEMBER 27TH)

Bishop Harvey of the Louisiana Conference of the United Methodist Church and Wybra Price, Shreveport District Superintendent, invite the members of St. Luke's United Methodist and all interested persons to attend the **Shreveport District Listening Session** for an overview of the proposed legislation to be considered at the 2019 Special Session of the General Conference in St. Louis February 23-26, 2019.

The Listening Session will be held on Tuesday, November 27<sup>th</sup> at First UMC, Shreveport (500 Common Street, Shreveport, LA 71101) from 6:00 – 8:00pm.

At the Listening Session, Bishop Harvey will...

- Provide a general overview of the report released from the 32-member Commission on a Way Forward
- ▶ Provide a general overview of the plans that will be considered by delegates with a specific focus on the Council of Bishops recommended plan
- ▶ Provide clarity on the process of what's happening now as well as what processes will take place before and during the Called Session of General Conference 2019
- Offer ideas on how individuals and churches can discuss the issues facing the church

Given the purpose of the Listening Session, the primary focus will be centered on information and clarification of the process rather than discussions of biblical interpretations or theological debates on homosexuality.
