

I looked across the sky at the clouds rolling in the distance. Watching the climbing temperature, I was grateful that the clouds were beginning to block the hot summer sun. As the sun receded behind the clouds I saw the temperature drop from 91 to 74. Grateful for any summer day in Louisiana when the temperature dropped out of the 90s, I relished the smell of summer rain in the air. As the rain began to fall I was reminded of a song that I used to sing back in the 1970s called "Without Clouds."

Without Clouds, the rain can't wash the land. Without Rain, the grass won't hide the sand. Without sand, the flowers bloom won't grow. Without pain, the joy of life won't show.

Oswald Chambers writes the following about clouds in "My Utmost for His Highest." In the Bible clouds are always associated with God. Clouds are the sorrows, sufferings, or providential circumstances, within or without our personal lives, which actually seem to contradict the sovereignty of God. Yet it is through these very clouds that the Spirit of God is teaching us how to walk by faith. If there were never any clouds in our lives, we would have no faith. "The clouds are the dust of His feet" (Nahum 1:3). They are a sign that God is there. What a revelation it is to know that sorrow, bereavement, and suffering are actually the clouds that come along with God! God cannot come near us without clouds—He does not always come in clear-shining brightness........

There are times in our lives when the clouds roll in and the rains come. Sometimes those clouds bring storms. Sometimes they simply bring relief from the heat. Sometimes the clouds bring gentle rain. I love the sunshine. I love to turn my face to the sun, close my eyes and bask in its warmth. But I also love the clouds and the rain. Particularly during the hot, dry, August days in Louisiana, the rain and the clouds bring welcome relief. And we need it. Perhaps we can be reminded by the clouds that God is in our midst, all around us and guiding us each day.
