"I was a stranger and you welcomed me."
- Matthew 25:35

One of the things I heard over and over in the neighborhood meetings was how much you loved being a "family" church. It is

always good to feel "at home" when you walk in the door. You know what to expect. You know the names of just about every face in the crowd, and they know your story, your sorrows, and your successes. Some of them even finish your sentences while the others just finish the dessert right off your plate. Yes, it is a place that is comfortable and familiar where everybody knows everybody, and each week is a family reunion.

But what about the stranger? The first-time guest? The unfamiliar face on the back row? Imagine walking into our sanctuary for the first time and not knowing anyone. Imagine being new to church and not knowing what to do or when to stand. Imagine hearing what we think is a familiar Bible story but to this person it is new news to their ears. Imagine not having any church experience at all except maybe when your grandmother took you to church on Christmas Eve or Easter morning. To them "family" church can make you feel more like an outsider than an insider. Everyone is visiting in the aisle during the passing of the peace, but no one is talking to you. You are just standing there on the fringes of this friendly frenzy not knowing what to do. Feeling left out, outcast, alone.

So where is the balance between church feeling like family and not becoming a dysfunctional family? I shared a great article with the church council that raised a similar concern. Please take a moment to read it: https://

So how do we welcome the stranger and help them to feel like a part of the family? Here are some things I would like to invite you to do each week in worship:

Sign in on the registration – guests are watching you. They want to fit in so they are going to do what you do. The only way we have to follow up with first time guests is if they sign the attendance pads. They won't share any more information if they see you aren't either. Yes I know

we have your address and phone number, but please do it anyway.

Be the pew police – we are creatures of habit. We sit in the same place each week. So look 3 rows up and 3 rows back. Is there an unfamiliar face? If so, greet them. Tell them your name first, then ask them their name. Before or after worship, introduce them to me. Invite them to sit with you. Tell them what ministry or small group you enjoy and invite them to join you. They may decline, but at least they will walk out having felt welcomed.

Rule of 3 – It takes 3 minutes for a guest to get out the door and to their car. Take the first three minutes after worship to greet our guests before you visit with your friends.

When I was a stranger you welcomed me!

Now go and do likewise,
