

When I came to St. Luke's over three years ago, I remember saying three things.

- 1. I have no agenda.
- 2. I will share with you what I see.
- 3. I don't know what God's plan is for St Luke's

I asked that you pray with me for God to guide us and help me to listen. And so we began. I learned about you and you came to know me. As I shared some of what I saw and you shared with me some of the needs in the church we began to make some changes, upgrades and updates. With the incredible generosity of Zoe Ramsey, we were able to pay off our debt, invest some money for the future and complete several projects. I came to love the work and ministry of the Pumpkin Patch that has raised money to provide support for many non-profit groups who are doing great work.

We continued to share ministry and pray. Then they began to come. Without anyone anticipating it or seeking it out, people began to call and knock on our door. Twelve step groups looking for a place to call home. The Trustees graciously agreed to welcome them, to share what we have—a place to call home. And now we host seven groups—six AA groups and one Al Anon group. It shouldn't surprise us, recovery work is deep in the DNA of St. Luke's. Considering our history with Oakwood Home for Women and the incredible impact of people like C.D. Barnes, being a church that offers hope and healing, particularly to those struggling with addictions, seems as natural as rain.

Where is God taking us? What is our future and the future of the AMOR ministry? I honestly don't know. I am grateful that St. Luke's has taken the step in faith to underwrite the position that David Bingham holds as Lay Pastor for Recovery Ministry for two years. I am excited to have someone on staff who understands recovery ministry, has experience, and has mentors who are leading life-changing recovery ministry programs. David is working hard connecting with people across the Shreveport-Bossier community learning about the recovery resources, discovering collaborations, exploring the needs and raising funds for AMOR at St. Luke's in order to make AMOR self-sustaining.


In order for the recovery community to connect, the Low-Key service of recovery, needs to be consistent and weekly. Funds have come in to allow for six weeks of uninterrupted Low-Key services and additional funds are committed. Beginning Friday, May 11th we will embark on six weeks of Low-Key at 6 pm every Friday night. In week 5, we will evaluate whether the funding will allow weekly services to continue or we need a re-set.

One of the great things about 12 step work through AA and Al-Anon is the protection of privacy. Participants use only their first names and there is a commitment to anonymity. One of the challenges of that same great policy is that in protecting the privacy of persons in recovery the people of St. Luke's don't get the benefit of hearing the stories, the testimonies and difference that this ministry is making. While you cannot see their faces or hear their voices, here are some of the things that have been said regarding what happens each week through AMOR (A Ministry of Recovery).

I am so grateful to St. Luke's for providing us a place. This group is a lifeline for me.

I have attended meetings in several churches. We have never been so warmly welcomed and made to feel at home like we are at St. Luke's. This work is hard and it means so much to be treated respectfully.

Thank you for your warm smiles and welcoming words. And ... I LOVE your Pumpkin Patch!

I haven't had very good experiences with churches. Most of my life I have felt judged and excluded like I wasn't really good enough. But something seems different at St. Luke's. If I ever have enough courage to try to trust church again, I'm going to try St. Luke's.

The acceptance, love and support have changed my life. No one interrupts, judges or gives unsolicited advice, which lets me find my way. It has made God's love real for me. Thank you.

Every time I show up, I hear what I need for recovery. Al-Anon has given me hope.
