

Disaster Response

As we watch the floodwaters devastate South Texas and move through Louisiana many of us are wondering what we can do to help. It is clearly going to be a long road to recovery and no one yet knows either the full impact or the definitive path but people are beginning to organize. Here are some reminders and opportunities.

Be sure that any organization to which you contribute financially is legitimate. One of the best ways to give is to work through known organizations with a track record for disaster

As you look for ways to help, consider these recommendations:

UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) - Checks can be made to St. Luke's with UMCOR in the memo line.

As of recently, the UMCOR Sager Brown Depot only had 18,000 flood buckets available. This will not be enough to meet the impending need before us.

Both supplies and funding are needed to help in this disaster response.

Flood buckets. You can pack a flood bucket hygiene kit and deliver it personally to Grace Community UMC at 9400 Ellerbe Road in Shreveport of to Asbury UMC at 3200 Airline Drive in Bossier where the buckets will be collected and delivered. PLEASE use the precise list found at:

All will need to be carried by God's Spirit as we make our way through the days ahead.

As I watch hundreds of citizen volunteers pitch in to rescue the stranded who are flooded out by Hurricane Harvey, then other volunteers organize to feed and house the stranded I am encouraged by the common decency of humanity when needs so great arise. I am impressed by the way people offer what they have no matter how much or how little. What always fascinates me the most in times of need is how people with only a little are so quick to offer what they have. Offering what we have and who we are to making the world a better place is what we are all created for - it is a core piece of our divine destiny. Interestingly health studies reveal that people who invest their time, energy and resources in helping others have fewer serious health events than those who don't. Isn't that AMAZING? God's design is that we live better when we live generously. Many generous people already know that. We know that we feel better, breathe better and are generally more joyful when we are investing in needs beyond ourselves. As Christians we shouldn't be surprised. Jesus tells us that he came to bring life and bring it more abundantly (John 10:10) AND he says that if we want to find our life, we must lose it. (Matthew 10:39)

During August and September at St. Luke's we are recommitting to being good stewards of all of our resources. Our promise as United Methodists is to uphold the church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. We gave some time in August to exploring and identifying our talents and spiritual gifts. Many responded to the time and talent survey by identifying interests and ways we would like to support God's work in and through St. Luke's and people are getting involved in things about which they care.

As we move into September I invite you to pick up a pledge card and give prayerful consideration to what God is calling you to give financially to the work at St. Luke's. Many of us give generously to organizations and needs beyond the walls of St. Luke's and those are so very important. I truly believe God leads us to the places where our resources need to go so pay careful and prayerful attention to God's nudging.

Our theme for the stewardship campaign is "Honor the Past/Serve the Present/Provide for the Future." We are greatly blessed at St. Luke's by many of God's faithful who planted the seeds for God's work in this place. We see the fruits of their labor in so many ways - in our lovely prayer garden, in our beautiful sanctuary, in the ministry of music and Upper Third and worship and education, in the mission of the Pumpkin Patch, AA and Oakwood Home. And we celebrate the many opportunities born out of their work that allow us to serve God and neighbor in the present time. We have so much fun together, growing, learning, celebrating and serving. Each time I sit with the children or visit with the youth I see their growing faith and the ways they are being formed as young Christians. I look at them and feel our responsibility to provide for their future here at St. Luke's.

I hope you will join me in honoring our past, serving the present and providing for the future of God's great church planted here at the corner of Youree Drive and Sand Beach Boulevard. May God lead us together into God's plan for us in 2018.
