Deeply grieved at their unyielding hearts...

This morning at Lectio Divina the scripture used was Mark 3:1-6. I was captured by the phrase that said Jesus was deeply grieved by their unyielding hearts. Unyielding hearts. As I sat in silence with that phrase, I thought about how the season of Lent is an invitation to yield our heart to God and to God's work.

How do I yield my heart to God? If we think of how we yield in other ways, we might consider what that word means in our everyday lives. If I am driving and come to a yield sign, I know that I allow the other traffic to go first. Perhaps part of the way we understand yielding our hearts to God is allowing God to go before us. It can be easy to get ahead of God, to push God out of the way, or to ignore the yield sign altogether and cause potential damage. Another way we use the term in our everyday language is when we yield the floor in a conversation. When we are spouting forth our ideas, our position, and our opinions and we yield the floor, we stop talking. We sit down and hopefully, we set aside our agenda to listen to the other. Perhaps one of the ways we yield our heart to God is being willing to set aside our agenda long enough to listen to God.

I imagine that God is often deeply grieved by our unyielding hearts. It must be awfully hard to get through to us and to use us for furthering God's kingdom when we are busy driving ahead and constantly yakking with our opinions and our agendas and our plans.

I am hearing God's invitation to yield to God. I hope you might join me during this Lenten season as we allow God to teach, guide, and lead. What are some practical ways we can yield? Consider picking up one or more of these practices during this season:

Read the words of Jesus as they are recorded in the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John

Walk the labyrinth in the St. Luke's prayer garden and let the walking be a time of yielding

Participate in centering prayer on Wednesday morning at 10 am in the sanctuary

Participate in Koinonia Bible study on Wednesday morning at 7 am in the conference room

Participate in Lectio Divina on Thursday morning at 8 am in the Seekers classroom

Sit quietly in the early morning and invite God into your day
Attend Maundy Thursday service at 6 pm Thursday, March 29, 2018
Attend Good Friday reading at 12:15 pm Friday, March 30, 2018
I just wonder what God may do in and through us as we yield our hearts to


God's Spirit. Who knows what may emerge come Easter?!
